The Building Committee has been hard at work this quarter continuing to refine plans for our facility.

Building Committee Accomplishments in the last 90 days:

- Church Interior Task Force transitioned to the Building Committee.
 - At the November Charge Conference meeting, in accordance with The Book of Discipline, a vote was ratified to create a Building Committee who will carry on the work of the Church Interiors Task Force (CITF) study committee.
 - During that transition, Andrew Gay elevated to Committee Chair and the team added two new members, Jane Frantz and Christine Moser, who bring their experience in project management and design to the group.
- The CITF produced a summary white paper of their work which is posted on our website here.
- Further defining Schematic and Financial Scope: Worked closely with INTEC to develop and deliver the Schematic and Financial Packages based upon feedback of major areas, floor plan designs, and budgetary pricing.

- Complete Scope of Work: Determine agreed scope of work and develop an updated pricing plan with INTEC.
